Course Objectives

This three-part seminar series will focus on three major ocean and sea issues to highlight their societal importance in the future: ocean and human health, aquaculture, and seabed mapping. The course is designed by and for educators at both informal and formal education institutions, for all ages and at all student grade levels. Scientists, graduate students, business and government personnel and any other interested citizens from across the Atlantic are invited to participate.

The online program will include recorded video presentations, live video conferences, resources, and the compilation of all relevant products and videos created for the Sea Change Project.

Each real-time live event will feature presentations by marine scientists who are internationally recognised experts in their disciplines. Following the presentations, participants will be afforded the opportunity to speak directly with the scientists and ask questions about seabed mapping and aquaculture, and about the scientifically-proven relationships between the ocean and human health.

Graduate Credit:

One US graduate credit will be available from Ashland University in Ohio USA in co-operation with the College of Exploration. A special online area for graduates will provide those participants with weekly assignments and a larger final assignment needed to complete the course.

After the workshop, you will:

- 1 Understand the importance of mapping the ocean
- 2 Know the latest plans and actions to map the seabed
- 3 Be able to discuss the advantages and challenges of aquaculture
- 4 Identify key aspects of the relationship between the ocean and human health
