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## Summary

The NSF Coastlines and People (CoPe) program supports diverse, innovative, multi-institutional Coastal Research Hubs focused on critically important coastlines and people research integrated with broad participation goals. Hubs are structured using a convergent science approach at the nexus between coastal sustainability, human dimension and coastal processes to transform the understanding of interactions amongst natural, human-built and social systems in coastal populated environments. CoPe supports (1) Focused Hubs - projects worth USD 1 million or less per year for 3 to 5 years and (2) Large-scale Hubs / projects worth USD 2-4 million per year for up to 5 years.

# **Priority Activities (first 2 years)**

CoPe Hubs embrace broadening participation and stakeholder engagement as key values and organizing principles integrated into the design of the hub and choice of science priorities to explore. Broadening participation, in the context of CoPe, includes rethinking how we approach and prioritize scientific questions to get diverse individuals involved in science.

Hub proposals can be submitted by Institutions of Higher Education or non-profit, non-academic organizations such as independent museums, observatories, research labs, professional societies and similar organizations associated with educational or research activities.

- <u>First Round</u> proposals have been reviewed and selected Hubs will be announced mid-2021.
- <u>Next Round</u> reviews for both Focused and Large-Scale Hub proposals will take place in late 2021. Research Hubs will address issues operating at multiple scales and link science, stakeholder engagement and education into developing pathways towards sustainability in changing coastal environments.
