## **Summary**

The contribution of ocean science to sustainable development is determined by people. Understanding the actors involved, their knowledge systems, culture and wellbeing, and how power dynamics and decision-making processes influence our oceans is crucial to achieve the goals of the Decade. There is a need to ensure knowledge, strategy and governance frameworks to enable all to participate in, contribute to and benefit equitably from the Decade. The Oceans Voices program will conduct research, incubate ideas, facilitate critical discussions and convene capacity building partnerships to identify barriers, pathways and enabling conditions for equity in the Decade.

## **Priority Activities (first 2 years)**

- Interdisciplinary solutions-oriented research to advance understanding of the problems facing ocean-dependent people, factors influencing the contribution of ocean science to sustainable development and the barriers and the enabling conditions for equity, fairness and justice.
- Workshops and events to facilitate knowledge exchange and partnerships and stimulate discussion across disciplinary, sectoral and geographical boundaries.
- Develop and enhance accessibility to interdisciplinary tools and frameworks to promote equitable engagement in the Decade.
