## ICG/NEAMTWS Task Team on Tsunami Ready Mandate

Appendix 5 to Decisions and Recommendations ICG/NEAMTWS-XVII (2021)

The Task Team on Tsunami Ready Team will:

- i. Promote the Tsunami Ready programme in the NEAM region and encourage Member States to join the program;
- ii. Coordinate and foster cooperation among NEAM countries and other regions worldwide on Tsunami Ready programme in place, as well as exchange knowledge, experiences and best practices;
- iii. Provide advice on the procedures to achieve a Tsunami Ready recognition;
- iv. Adapt the standards in NEAM region according to the IOC UNESCO Tsunami Ready guidelines;
- v. Report to and have a **strong interaction** with the ICGNEAMTWS/**WG4**.





- 1. Promote and encourage Tsunami Ready Programme to MS governments and municipalities
  - Design and conduct **face to face and online events** (1-2 events / year), to explain and promote TR programme and benefits, and the process to be carried out to accomplish with the whole programme (e.g., *like Egypt or IOTIC events*).

These events have also relation to ToR point 3 ("Provide advice on the procedures to achieve TR recognition")

- 2. Coordinate and foster cooperation among NEAM countries and other regions worldwide on Tsunami Ready programme in place, as well as exchange knowledge, experiences and best practices.
  - Identify critical points (TR indicator by indicator), identify methods and activities held by countries in NEAM and other ICG regions to accomplish them (*problems vs. solutions*).
  - Establish strong interaction with other ICGs; IO, Caribe and Pacific, to learn from their expertise and exchange knowledge.
  - Give advice on good practices based on these experiences and expert advice.
  - Organize workshops (e.g., like ISPRA event, Ocean Decade Satellite activity).





- 3. Provide advice on the procedures to achieve TR recognition
  - Linked to activities foreseen related to ToR point 1
  - Provide advice to new potential candidate communities for Tsunami Ready.
  - Strong coordination with Tsunami Unit.
  - Clarify and integrate roles and activities of TT-TR in NEAMTIC, to avoid overlapping with running TR projects (e.g., CoastWAVE) and Tsunami Unit/IOC Secretariat.
- 4. Adapt the standards in NEAM region according to the IOC UNESCO Tsunami Ready guidelines
  - Review standards in the NEAM region to explore if it is required to further adapt standards to NEAM region particularities.
  - Review if adaptation should be made to the standards based on the need to include non-seismic tsunami generation mechanisms.
- 5. Report to and have a strong interaction with the ICGNEAMTWS/WG4.
  - Strong interaction with WG4. Establish 2 regular meetings, regardless additional needs of interaction.
  - Also needed strong interaction with WG1, 2 and 3.

### **ALLIGNMENT ICG/NEAMTWS 2030 STRATEGY**

Objective 3.6: Establish rapid and effective evacuation mechanisms given the risk assessment guidance and data.

• Emergency plans for tsunamis, from the national to the local/municipality level of coastal areas. These should include full evacuation zone maps and route plans, which have to be made easily available to the citizens. Information must be able to reach all population strata, via multiple and redundant communication media (TV, radio, newspapers, web, social media, etc.) -> Indicators TR and TT-TR future actions.

Objective 3.7: Develop and conduct regular exercises to test early warning systems and evacuation mechanisms

• Member States should organise periodic drills involving all levels of the alerting chain, including local authorities and citizens. The involvement of both broadcast and social media is recommended --Indicators TR and TT-TR future actions.

Objective 3.8: Roll out the "Tsunami Ready" initiative in coastal communities

- Tsunami Ready initiative should be tested and applied to some pioneering local coastal communities in each country, which could then be taken as examples for others to follow.
- Lessons learnt from awareness-raising initiatives (such as the EU-JRC funded "Last Mile" and CoastWAVE project together with others organised routinely in many countries) will be analysed for the possible insights they can provide towards a sustainable Tsunami Ready initiative within the NEAMTWS 

  Indicators TR and TT-TR future actions.
