Training Overview

The training workshop will cover tsunami warning operations and the use of the PTWC Products for national tsunami threat decision-making, with specific attention on the warning and emergency response plan and standard operating procedures (SOPs) of the Cook Islands. Topics will include warning and response SOPs and challenges, warning decision support tools, warning messages and alerting, evacuation concepts and planning, and awareness strategies.

In response to the Hunga-Tonga Hunga-Ha'apai Volcano eruption and tsunami, the Intergovernmental Coordination Group for the Pacific Tsunami Warning and Mitigation System (PTWS), established a <u>Task Team on Hunga-Tonga Hunga-Ha'apai (HTHH) Volcano Tsunami</u> <u>Hazard Response</u> under PTWS Working Group 2 to immediately develop the Hunga Tonga Hunga Ha'apai (HTHH) Interim Procedures and PTWS Products for responding to the possibility of future tsunamis originating from volcanic eruptions or processes similar to the HTHH event. These SOPs became effective on 15 March 2022 through IOC Circular Letter <u>2882</u>, and are carried out by the PTWC acting as a PTWS Tsunami Service Provider (TSP). IOC Circular Letter <u>2902</u> (17 August 2022) provided the PTWC Interim Products and PTWS Products User's Guide. The Procedures Products were tested by members of Pacific Islands Countries and Territories Regional Working Group on Tsunami Warning and Mitigation (WG-PICT) on 9th November, 2022 as a Regional Exercise for the Exercise Pacific Wave 2022 (PacWave22-PICT).

The workshop will facilitate Cook Islands' review of both seismic (which account for 87% of the world's tsunamis) and non-seismic tsunami sources in their SOPs. Accordingly, the goal of this training is to increase the capacity of warning center and first responder operational staff to efficiently and effectively respond to tsunamis.

The key objectives of this workshop are to

• Review and update the Cook Islands Tsunami Warning and Emergency Response SOP, with consideration to the ICG/PTWS Local Source Tsunami Response Best Practice Guideline (draft 2019) and HTHH Interim Procedures and PTWS Products.

- Test the Cook Islands' tsunami SOPs through a table top exercise
- Understand how to interpret and use the PTWC Products for national tsunami threat decision-making
- Understand the tsunami warning and emergency response activities, their challenges, and limitations
- Review the science of earthquakes and tsunamis, Cook Island regional tectonics, seismicity, and tsunami hazards
