Subject: Launch of the Ocean CD-Hub – An invitation to contribute information on capacity development opportunities in a global repository

On 3 February 2023, the IOC launched the Ocean CD-Hub (<u>http://oceancd.org/</u>), a global repository of information on capacity development in ocean science and management. The new platform will serve as a central repository of capacity development opportunities (e.g., trainings and higher education, fellowships, internships, grants, etc.) offered by national educational institutions and, as well, regional and global organizations. By providing centralized (and curated) access to a global supply of ocean capacity development, the Ocean CD-Hub will facilitate search of capacity development opportunities for users. It will also assist providers to promote their training.

The Ocean CD-Hub also aims to identify synergies and potential partnerships between many organizations providing capacity development opportunities, avoiding duplication of efforts and mutualizing resources. It can also make it easier for governments to report on progress and availability of capacity development opportunities in the context of global efforts such as the Sustainable Development Goals and the challenges of the United Nations Decade of Ocean Science for Sustainable Development (2021–2030).

With this letter, I would like to invite you to contribute to the Ocean CD-Hub information on existing capacity development opportunities provided by your country and its relevant institutions and organizations.

To facilitate the submission of entries, a simple Word form is provided here for any additional information you would like to share. Since the platform is still in its early stage, kindly note that the Word template is a temporary solution while we are working on additional improvements including an interface for direct access of potential contributors in the future. We would appreciate receiving your submission(s) at your earliest convenience but not later than 31 March 2023.

Training & Higher Education	In person, hybrid or online training opportunities, e.g., regional training centres,
	workshops, summer schools, leadership seminars, e-learning platforms, etc.
Onboard Expeditions, Research &	Opportunities for hands on/practical training, research or expeditions on board
Training	vessels or ships.
Fellowships	Opportunities for expanding both professional and personal networks, experiential learning, and professional development.
Internships/Jobs	Professional learning experiences that offer meaningful, practical work related to a student's field of study or career interest. An internship promotes career exploration and development, and teaches new skills. Job opportunities for careers related to ocean science and management.
Mentorships	A reciprocal and collaborative relationship that often occurs between a senior and junior professional for the purpose of the mentee's growth, learning, and career development.
Visiting Lecturers/Scholars & Exchanges	Visiting Lecturers/Scholars visit a host institution to teach, lecture, or perform research on a topic for which the visitor is valued.
