
CAPACITY DEVELOPMENT - DEFINITION, TOOLS, APPROACHES

Capacity development is about transformations that empower individuals, leaders, organizations and societies. If something does not lead to change that is generated, guided and sustained by those whom it is meant to benefit, then it cannot be said to have enhanced *capacity*, even if it has served a valid *development* purpose. - UNDP

Capacity building (development) is the improvement in an individual's or organization's facility (or capability) "to produce, perform or deploy"


CAPACITY DEVELOPMENT - DEFINITION, TOOLS, APPROACHES

4+ levels for implementing - 1) organisational, 2) national 3) regional,

- Defining tools what are the tools in place, what are the tools needed to be added, how can the results be monitored



- 2- Capacity development of best practices






BEST PRACTICES FOR CAPACITY DEVELOPMENT

- What formal courses are there? Are BPs already taught? Can we create a module/MOOC






THE GAME IS CHANGING

- 1. What are the key factors to consider human interaction; education; resources/economy; language
- 2. Co-design for sustainability people are best empowered to realize their full potential when the means of development are sustainable - home-grown, long-term, and generated and managed collectively by those who stand to benefit - How do we sustain the institutional capacity as people in the institution change?
- 3. To what end do we need to develop this capacity? What will be its purpose?
- 4. Whose capacities need to be developed? Which group or individuals need to be empowered?
- 5. What kinds of capacities need to be developed to achieve the broader development objectives?
- 6. A BP leads to optimal outcomes. Can we measure that we have developed capacity in a particular way and because of this capacity has increased as compared to developing it in a different way? How can we assess when capacity has been developed or how can we measure what we have achieved if it is an evolving process?
