




Status of MSP around the world







By April 2022:


- ~ 300 MSP initiatives from 102 countries/territories, including both government-led processes and pilot exercises
- 38 countries have approved plans (national, sub-national and/or local scale)
- The initiatives range from integrated coastal zone and marine plans, strategic or comprehensive plans

Status of MSP in the Wider Caribbean



- **IOC surveys** in 2018, 2020, 2021*, 2022
- 19 country profiles, but 9 are not up-to-date (2018) and at least 3 more countries have MSP initiatives but did not report
- Advanced MSP processes: Dominica, Grenada, Mexico, St Kitts and Nevis, St Lucia, St Vincent and the Grenadines

> MSProadmap & MSPqlobal Project

- Target (global): At least 1/3 of the global maritime areas under national jurisdictions with marine spatial plans by 2030
- Knowledge & Tools + Transboundary Pilots
- 1st Phase
 - ~150 activities, such as trainings, workshops, stakeholder meetings and International MSPforum
 - ~5,000 different stakeholders from over 140 countries
 - >15 publications, incl. new guide on MSP
- 2nd Phase
 - MSPglobal 2.0 will start soon!

Global developments



High Level Panel for a Sustainable Ocean Economy

- Target (members): 100% of their national jurisdictions managed by Sustainable Ocean Plans (SOPs), which is an umbrella plan that includes MSP as an area-based component
- Ocean Action 2030: Members of the coalition (including IOC-UNESCO) provide technical and/or financial support to members of the Ocean Panel
- Ocean Decade Programme on Sustainable Ocean Planning



Regional activities in 2021/2022





When: October 2021

Objective:

 Reinforce capacities of managerial and technical positions at fishing ports and related sectors on MSP



When: December 2021

Objectives:

- Inform on opportunities to further advance MSP & BE

- Assess the status of MSP & BE
- Identify the need for eventual support from UNDP/GEF PROCARIBE+ and IOC-UNESCO



When: December 2022

Objectives:

- Support a dialogue process to share experiences on MSP, including on priority areas of the MSProadmap
- Reinforce existing regional frameworks, looking for synergies between MSPrelated programs within and beyond IOC-UNESCO
