









Analysis of Ocean Decade Actions in SIDS










- 21 (6%) of Decade Actions state that they are working in SIDS
- Fewer than half of those are led by partners based in SIDS countries
- Most SIDS Decade Actions on Challenges 9 – Capacity Development, 10 – Ocean Literacy and 2 – Ecosystem Management
- Significant gaps in Actions related to pollution, sustainable blue food and sustainable ocean economy
- Partners in Pacific SIDS most commonly engaged, followed by Africa and then Caribbean








Support for National Decade Committees

 - Support outreach and engagement via standardized communications assets and suggested messaging






Vision 2030 – a collective ambition for the Ocean Decade Challenges






- First iteration of M&E

- Next step in development is collectively identify the end-goal of each Ocean Decade Challenge, and steps measure progress to that goal
- Engagement by SIDS partners will be essential via Expert Working Groups & review processes



Strategic ambition setting via 'Vision 2030 Process'

- Overall portfolio of existing Decade
 Actions developed through strongly
 bottom-up approach driven by
 proponents of Decade Actions
- Critical moment being approached:
 - Strong demand from Decade community to shape a common vision for the next 8 years & enhance collective impact and measure progress to achievement of Ocean Decade Challenges
 - Unique window of opportunity to <u>deliberately design the 'science</u> <u>we need'</u> and avoid dispersion of Decade Actions
 - Growing need to <u>measure &</u> <u>document impact</u> of the Ocean Decade







2021 United Nations Decade of Ocean Science for Sustainable Development



- Funding secured for Ocean Decade Capacity
 Development Facility
- The Facility will identify specific needs for Capacity
 Development in the Decade and meet those needs
 through existing and new initiatives
- Focus on needs of ECOPS, SIDS and LDCs
- Aim is to build a multi-partner Facility for the life of the Decade and beyond
- Aims to consolidate and optimize CD initiatives from IOC and partners
- Recruitment of dedicated human resources in DCU for capacity development
- Will commence in June 2023 with first call in October 2023 as part of CFDA No. 06/2023



Implementation of Ocean Decade Data & Information Strategy



Vision for 2030

A trusted, inclusive, and interconnected ocean data and information ecosystem that is actively used for decision making to support sustainable ocean management.

Mission

To catalyse a solution-oriented, global digital transformation for the digital ecosystem we need to overcome the Decade Challenges.

Strategic Objectives

- 1. Develop an ocean digital ecosystem that facilitates sharing & equitable access to multidisciplinary data, information and knowledge by all.
- 2. Improve data and information discovery and usability across the ocean digital ecosystem.
- 3. Build **trust** in data and information shared across the ocean digital ecosystem.
- 4. Prioritise digital solutions that support decisions for sustainable ocean management.
- Expand, empower, and mobilise global communities to advance and maintain the ocean digital ecosystem.

- Collaboration in the Flagship SIDS Initiative of the UN Decade on Ecosystem Restoration for SIDS SIDS learning on pathways to a sustainable blue economy
- Potential joint leadership of Ocean Decade Alliance and SIDS Coalition for Nature on implementing 8. Priority 2 of the Coalition's Call to Action re. data, technology transfer and SIDS-SIDS cooperation
- Visible presence of SIDS interests relevant to ocean science and knowledge at SDG Summit (September 2023) in lead up to 4th International SIDS Conference

2024 Ocean Decade Conference Barcelona, Spain: 10 - 12 April 2024

- Milestone event to convene Decade Actions and Decade partners to celebrate achievements, take stock and set collective vision for coming years
- Results of Vision 2030 will be workshopped and 'validated' during the Conference
- Main 3-day conference, complemented by partner-led satellite events
- Strong engagement by SIDS partners will be encouraged and supported
