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


### **Towards a Decade Sustainable Ocean Planning Programme**

Science based approach to sustainable ocean planning developed through a common framework, and supported by specific research, data analysis and models, scenario development and policy applications/tools

A <u>global hub for ocean planning stakeholders</u> to access resources and skills and track progress globally, in national and transboundary contexts.

<u>Development of human and institutional capacities</u> in SOP, through training, education, ocean literacy and south-south/north south cooperation mechanisms;

National SOP processes established and/or consolidated through financial and technical support, in coordination with Ocean Action 2030 Coalition





# **IOS Evaluation of IOC strategic positioning**

EC-55 request to estimate needed budget and resources Assessment and response in Circular Letter 2912, October 2022

Sustainable delivery and expansion of IOC activities:

estimate of required budget, including human resource needs

October 2022

(Document distributed by IOC Circular Letter No. 2912)



### **IOC's current situation - budget**

Overall biennial integrated budget for IOC of \$31.8 million, of which \$11.2 million is RP, i.e. 2.1% of UNESCO's overall RP Earlier agreed ratio salaries/activities: 75%-25%, now (2022–2023): 84%-16%

EXB: 5% (\$20.6 million), only \$4.4 million of EXB secured

**Recommendations:** 

increase of workforce from 60 to 90, staff outside RP requires more stability, increase of budget from 30M\$ to 50M\$, need stable "core voluntary contributions"

UNESCO General Conference – 42 (November 2023) to decide on RP
