

Decade Programmes by Challenges

- Lead institutions in 60 countries but low leadership from SIDS and LDCs
- **Engagement of over:**
 - 3500 research institutions
 - 4500 Early Career Ocean Professionals
 - Women represent 56% of participants in Decade Actions
 - 25,000 diverse knowledge products already generated
 - Call for Decade Actions 05/2023 currently open

Resource and support needs of endorsed Decade Actions:

• Approximately 20% of resources secured for next 12 month period

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- Estimated annual resource needs of 400 500 million USD
- Support commonly requested for communications, coordination & fundraising

- Tailored but similar mandates including:
 - i. Coordination of Decade Actions & catalysis of new Actions
 - ii. Gap analyses and priority setting
 - iii. Resource mobilisation
 - iv. Communications and outreach
 - v. Monitoring and reporting
- Primary / secondary attachments of Decade Actions operational and peer – peer collaboration emerging
- IOC-led DCOs require additional resources
- Important thematic and geographical gaps persist

IOC Contribution to Ocean Decade



- IOC remains leading UN agency in terms of number of endorsed Decade Actions:
 - Leading 7 endorsed Programmes
 - Leading 9 endorsed Projects
 - Leading 3 Decade Coordination Offices
 - Key partner in 5 other endorsed programmes
- Unique opportunity to use Decade to reinforce IOC globally and regionally inc. post-Decade:
 - Leading preparation of new Sustainable Ocean Planning programme
 - Reinforcement of sub-commissions as regional ocean science hubs via DCO creation in IOCAFRICA, IOCARIBE and WESTPAC (already established)
 - Positioning of IOC in 2025 UN Ocean Conference

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- Voluntary, inclusive, multi-stakeholder platforms that coordinate, support and increase MS participation in Decade through influencing national priorities, working across science-policy-society and informing funding strategies

- Major gaps persist in SIDS, LDCs and certain regions => DCU developing tools to increase support to new NDCs and ensure impact beyond the Decade




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2. Existing & Emerging Initiatives

Supporting Demand Driven Capacity Development

- Funding secured from Government of Flanders for Ocean Decade Capacity Development Facility
- The Facility will *identify specific needs for Capacity Development in the Decade and meet those needs* through existing and new initiatives
- Ambition to be a multi-partner Facility for the life of the Decade and beyond
- Aims to consolidate and optimize CD initiatives from IOC and partners with focus on needs of ECOPS, SIDS and LDCs
- Recruitment of dedicated human resources in DCU for capacity development
- Will commence in 2nd half of 2023 with first call in October 2023 as part of CFDA No. 06/2023





Increasing engagement in SIDS

- 6% of Decade Actions working in SIDS fewer than half of those are led by SIDS partners
- Significant gaps in Actions related to pollution, sustainable blue food and sustainable ocean economy

UN Agencies and the Ocean Decade

- 26 (9%) of Decade Actions are led by UN Agencies...but only 3% of Decade Actions are led by UN Agencies other than IOC/UNESCO
- Preliminary findings of an ongoing analyses:
 - i. UN agencies are diverse in their relationship to science and how they support and use it
 - ii. UN agencies collectively cover all Ocean Decade Challenges
 - iii. All UN agencies, individually and collectively, operate to at the sciencepolicy interface
 - iv. There is strong interest and diverse benefits for UN agency participation in the Ocean Decade
 - v. UN engagement does not always align well with the Decade Action structure

Vision 2030 Process

- Overall portfolio of existing Decade Actions developed through <u>strongly bottom-up</u> <u>approach driven by proponents of Decade</u> <u>Actions</u>
- Critical moment being approached:
 - 1. Strong demand from Decade community to <u>shape a common vision</u> for the next 8 years & enhance collective impact and measure progress to achievement of Ocean Decade Challenges
 - 2. Unique window of opportunity to <u>deliberately design the 'science we</u> <u>need'</u> and avoid dispersion of Decade Actions
 - 3. Growing need to <u>measure &</u> <u>document impact</u> of the Ocean Decade





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- Vision 2030 will set a Challenge specific strategic ambition to answer the following...
- 1. What does success look like for this Ocean Decade Challenge at the end of the Decade?
- 2. What milestones / targets do we need to achieve throughout the Decade to be on the path for success for this Challenge?

A strategic ambition will allow measurement of progress towards fulfillment of Challenges leading to:

- 1. Identification of achievements and successes
- 2. Identification of residual gaps and future priorities
- 3. Alignment of resources to priority needs
- 4. Refinement / addition of Challenges


Vision 2030 as part of Decade evaluation framework

Perspectives for Next Period





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- Strong portfolio of existing Decade Actions needs continued support for coordination, implementation and strategic communication of science for uptake
- Robust foundation of IOC contributions to the Decade established and operational but require additional resources for sustainability and to optimise Decade and post-Decade benefits for IOC at global and in regions
- Growing examples of benefits of National Decade Committees but critical mass not yet achieved in terms of number of Committees
- Initiatives for increased engagement of SIDS and Africa taking shape but will require tangible buy-in from Member States and other partners
- Vision 2030 process will generate critical information on priorities and assist with targeted resource mobilisation
- Good growth and visibility of Ocean Decade Alliance and Foundations Dialogue, but will require further efforts to align resources and initiatives with priority needs of the Decade
- Unique series of upcoming global meetings to set collective ambition for Ocean Decade Challenges • and translate this ambition to well-resourced action across science – policy – society interface
- Continued Member State engagement at national, regional and global levels will be essential to achieving the ambition of the Decade in the critical period to 2025 and beyond!


