Visa / Entry Requirements

Kindly access Indonesia's <u>government visa information</u> for detailed information. Participants who are not exempted from that agreement but intend to travel using diplomatic and service passports may apply for a multiple entry diplomatic and service visa online through the following website https://molina.imigrasi.go.id/. Kindly contact Indonesia Embassy for more information.

Participants traveling with ordinary passports are strongly advised to apply for visas at accredited Indonesian Embassies or Consulates in their respective countries of residence. Each participant applying for an Indonesian visa to Indonesia must hold a valid passport with a minimum validity period of six months, a minimum of two blank passport pages for validation, and identical information between the country represented and the nationality of the owner.

Alternatively, the Government of the Republic of Indonesia applied Visit Visa Exemption or Visa on Arrival for Leisure Purpose to the following 93 countries which can currently also be granted for foreign nationals on official visits or government duties to attend international events including this workshop, with the additional requirement to enclose invitation and accreditation letter to attend the event:

- 1. The invitation letter from WMO/IOC Secretariat
- 3. Recommendation letter of assignment from their foreign ministry or other relevant institutions.

- 4. Travel insurance document which covers health financing while in Indonesia.
- 5. Vaccination certificates (digital or hard copy).
- 6. Proof of payment for VoA revenue of 500,000 IDR (during arrival in entry point).

The official currency of Indonesia is rupiah (currency code: IDR). The exchange rate to the US dollar is roughly at USD 1.0 = IDR 15,027,00 (per 21 July 2023) subject to daily variations.


Life and Health Insurance

Life/major health insurance for each participant is necessary and is the responsibility of the participant institution or Government. The Local Organizing Committee will not assume any responsibility for life and major health insurance, nor for expenses related to medical treatment or accidents.

Electricity

The standard voltage throughout Indonesia is normally 230 Volt and with a standard frequency of 50 Hz. Please consider bringing/ buying a voltage converter if you think necessary.

Most power plugs and sockets in Indonesia are type C and F, as below. If you are coming from a country that does not use this type of sockets, you should bring an adapter.



Climate of Nusa Dua, Bali in October

Bali has a tropical climate, hot all year round, with a rainy season from November to March, due to the northwest monsoon, and a relatively dry season from April to October, when, however, some showers can still occur. In the rainy season, it usually rains a couple of hours in the morning and a couple of hours in the afternoon, while in the rest of the day the sun shines for a few hours.
