## 1. Status of Implementation

## **Key Statistics from Ocean Decade Progress Report**

July 2022 - June 2023

#### **Engagement in Decade Actions:**

- 77,000 individuals
- 4,000 institutes
- 4,500 ECOPs
- 56% female

#### **Outcomes of Decade Actions:**

- 25,000 knowledge products
- 12,000 datasets
- 21,000 incidences of 'uptake'
- 4,000 capacity development initiatives = > 200,000 beneficiaries

#### **Decade Action leads:**

- 39% North America
- 30% Europe
- 14% Asia-Pacific
- 4% Africa
- 3% SIDS







   from SIDS and LDCs
- Five Calls for Decade Actions completed
- Call for Decade Actions 06/2023 currently open with focus on co-design ideas from Africa and Caribbean SIDS

## **Upcoming Endorsements**





- Major new contributions to be endorsed in January on marine life census and coral reef restoration following Call for Decade Actions No. 05/2023
- 32 new projects ready for endorsement from Call for Decade Actions No. 04/2022 and 05/2023
- 6 new Decade Implementing Partners in development
- In relation to Call for Decade Actions No. 06/2023:
  - 35 co-design proposals received (24 for Africa and 11 for Caribbean SIDS)
  - 26 project applications received to date (closes 31 January)
  - 5 programme applications invited (closes 31 January)



### **IOC Contribution to Ocean Decade**



- IOC remains leading UN agency in terms of number of endorsed Decade Actions:
  - Leading 7 endorsed Programmes
  - Leading 9 endorsed Projects
  - Leading 3 Decade Coordination Offices
  - Key partner in 5 other endorsed programmes
- Unique opportunity to use Decade to reinforce IOC globally and regionally inc. post-Decade:
  - Leading preparation of new Sustainable Ocean Planning programme
  - Reinforcement of sub-commissions as regional ocean science hubs via DCO creation in IOCAFRICA, IOCARIBE and WESTPAC (already established)
  - Positioning of IOC in 2025 UN Ocean Conference

### **Decentralised Coordination Structures**



- Strong network of Decade Coordination Offices (DCOs) and Decade Collaborative Centres (DCCs)
- Tailored but similar mandates including:
  - i. Coordination of Decade Actions & catalysis of new Actions through COPs
  - ii. Gap analyses and priority setting
  - iii. Resource mobilisation
  - iv. Communications and outreach
  - v. Monitoring and reporting
- Ideally DCOs/DCCs will have a life beyond the Decade


## **37 National Decade Committees**






## 2. Priority Initiatives

# **Supporting Demand Driven Capacity Development**

- Funding secured from Government of Flanders for Ocean Decade Capacity Development Facility
- Launched in December 2023 and first meeting of Project Steering Group held
- The Facility will identify specific needs for Capacity
   Development in the Decade and meet those needs
   through existing and new initiatives
- Aims to consolidate and IOC CD strategy and achievements and bring in new partners
- Focus on needs of ECOPS, SIDS and LDCs
- Multi-partner Facility for the life of the Decade and beyond
- Initial priority themes include co-design, data management, ILK, science-policy interface, marine pollution, marine biodiversity and ocean-climate nexus

#### **Strategic Objectives**


- 1. Develop an **ocean** digital ecosystem that facilitates sharing & equitable access to multidisciplinary data, information and knowledge by all.




## Increasing engagement in SIDS





- Few Decade Actions working in SIDS fewer than half are led by SIDS partners
- Significant gaps in Actions related to pollution, sustainable blue food and sustainable ocean economy

## **Vision 2030 Process**

- Overall portfolio of existing Decade Actions developed through <u>strongly bottom-up</u> <u>approach driven by proponents of Decade</u> <u>Actions</u>
- Critical moment being approached:
  - 1. Strong demand from Decade community to shape a common vision for the next 8 years & enhance collective impact and measure progress to achievement of Ocean Decade Challenges
  - Unique window of opportunity to <u>deliberately design the 'science we</u> <u>need'</u> and avoid dispersion of Decade Actions
  - Growing need to <u>measure & document</u> <u>impact</u> of the Ocean Decade




## Vision 2030 will set a Challenge specific strategic ambition to answer the following...



## Satellite Events during 'Ocean Decade Week'





- Approx. 350 satellite events proposed reduced to approx. 130 events after consultation with Programme Committee and merging of certain events
- 80 events to be held on 8 and 9 April in four distinct 'hubs' around Barcelona
- 50 high profile events to be held in the mornings and lunch-time slots of the Conference
- Exhibitions and films also being distributed in venues around Barcelona
