Subject: Data Buoy Cooperation Panel Training Workshop on Ocean Observations for Weather Forecast and Climate Prediction – Indian Ocean, 6–8 August 2024

<u>Action required:</u> To nominate participants for the Data Buoy Cooperation Panel Training Workshop by 17 May 2024

The Data Buoy Cooperation Panel (DBCP) is a joint body of the World Meteorological Organization (WMO) and the Intergovernmental Oceanographic Commission (IOC) of UNESCO, focused on global coordination of drifting and moored buoys, ice buoys and tsunami buoys to provide data for weather and climate applications. It is one of the Global Ocean Observing System (GOOS) networks, and is coordinated under the Observations Coordination Group (OCG).

At its thirty-ninth session (DBCP-39) held in Bali, Indonesia, in October 2023, the DBCP noted its continued success in regional training workshops held in 2016–2023 and endorsed support for the organization of the "Training Workshop on Ocean Observations for Weather Forecast and Climate Prediction-Indian Ocean" in 2024.

The workshop aims to enhance ocean observation for weather forecasting and climate prediction in the Indian and western Pacific Oceans. The themes for the workshop will include ocean data requirements, access and management, application in forecasting and climate prediction, and regional requirements and cooperation.

At the kind invitation from the Meteorology, Climatology, and Geophysics Agency (BMKG) of Indonesia, the workshop will take place as a hybrid meeting from 6 to 8 August 2024 in Citeko, Indonesia.

Through this workshop, GOOS and DBCP seek to contribute to regional capacity. I therefore encourage you to nominate potential trainees who might benefit from the training and support this aim. The workshop will offer an exceptional opportunity for participants to learn new skills and to make meaningful and ongoing contributions to major international programmes. The workshop objectives can be found in Annex 1, and the workshop will be conducted in English only. The programme, local arrangements (i.e., accommodation, visas, etc.), and any other information pertinent to the workshop will be posted, in due course, on the <u>event website</u>.

Once all the nominations have been received, a selection committee will be set up to select the most qualified experts in marine meteorological and oceanographic (met-ocean) forecasting or observations. Priority will be given to countries from the Indian Ocean and western Pacific Ocean regions. If places are available, applicants from other areas will be considered. The selection committee will deliberate beginning of May 2024, and will inform the selected experts shortly thereafter.
