Airports:

- **Borg El Arab Airport:** Located approximately 45 kilometers southwest of Alexandria city center, Borg El Arab Airport serves domestic and limited international flights.
- **Cairo International Airport:** The primary international gateway to Egypt, Cairo International Airport is about 220 kilometers from Alexandria. It offers numerous flights connecting to major cities worldwide.

Ground Transportation:

- **Taxis:** Taxis are readily available in Alexandria and are a convenient mode of transportation within the city. Negotiate fares before starting the journey or ensure the use of a metered taxi.

Visa:

Travelers planning a visit to Alexandria, Egypt, should be aware of the visa requirements for entry into the country. Here's some essential information regarding visas:

Visa Requirements:

- **Tourist Visa:** Most visitors to Egypt require a tourist visa for entry. Tourist visas can typically be obtained upon arrival at Egyptian airports and land borders. However, it's advisable to check
