Subject: Global Ocean Observing System (GOOS): Updates and Call for

Nominations for GOOS National Focal Points (NFP)

The Global Ocean Observing System (GOOS) supports, builds on, and adds value to national and regional sustained ocean observing efforts, and provides a global framework to ensure that the many significant national ocean observing systems deliver the information needed by society for climate, weather and hazard warnings, ocean health and management, and the blue economy.

National Focal Points (NFPs) of GOOS play a pivotal role as a channel of communication between GOOS and the national organizations and individuals involved in your Member State's sustained national ocean observing system infrastructure. Recognizing the important role of NFPs in developing a fit-for-purpose, integrated global ocean observing system at national level, the GOOS Steering Committee adopted the updated Terms of Reference (TOR) in April 2023.

The key roles of NFPs include fostering connections at the national level among elements involved in ocean observing, government stakeholders and beneficiaries of ocean information. NFPs are also responsible for fostering the integration of national data, modelling and ocean assessment activities to support the delivery of information to key national users through a national coordination mechanism (or national hub). Additionally, NFPs are tasked with ensuring the national priorities, plans, implementation status, needs and gaps related to sustained ocean observing system, are brought to the attention of GOOS.

There are currently 76 designated GOOS National Focal Points, with the <u>current list</u> of NFPs last updated in 2023 through <u>Circular Letter, 2931</u>. The Intergovernmental Oceanographic Commission (IOC) kindly requests Member States to update, as appropriate, the list of National Focal Points or, if no focal point has been appointed yet, to nominate their GOOS NFP using the attached Nomination Form (Annex 1). Although the NFP list may be updated at any time, the Secretariat would appreciate receiving updates to the current list or new nominations before <u>28 February 2025</u> by email to <u>goos@unesco.org</u>.
