

UNESCO-IOC Training Workshop on Tsunami Evacuation Maps, Plans, and Procedures and the UNESCO-IOC Tsunami Ready Recognition Programme for the Indian Ocean Member States 15-23 April 2025

Venue: International Training Centre for Operational Oceanography (ITCOOcean) UNESCO Category2Centre Indian National Centre for Ocean Information Services (INCOIS) Hyderabad, India

Information for Participants

1. Background

At the UNESCO-IOC 2nd Global Tsunami Symposium on commemorating the 20th year of the 2004 Indian Ocean Tsunami, it was agreed that the Indian Ocean is much safer against the threat of tsunamis than it was in 2004. The symposium came up with the statement "Global Tsunami Warning and Mitigation: Building Sustainability for the next decade through Transformation and Innovation", following which UNESCO and its partners called on States and civil society to drastically step up their investments and efforts to strengthen Tsunami Early Warning Systems and achieve 100% of Tsunami Ready Communities across the world by 2030.

In line with these priorities, the Intergovernmental Coordination Group for the Indian Ocean Tsunami Warning and Mitigation System (ICG/IOTWMS) at its 14th session in Jakarta, in November 2024, agreed for the UNESCO-IOC Indian Ocean Tsunami Information Centre (IOTIC) and the IOTWMS Secretariat to conduct the Tsunami Evacuation Plans, Maps, and Procedures (TEMPP) training workshop in 2025.

This training workshop will be hosted in Hyderabad from 15-23 April 2025 by the Indian National Centre for Ocean Information Services (INCOIS), Ministry of Earth Sciences (MoES), Govt. of India.

The objectives of the training workshop include:

- Strengthening capacities of IOTWMS Member States to develop Tsunami Evacuation Maps, Plans, and Procedures
- Strengthening capacities of IOTWMS Member States to implement UNESCO-IOC Tsunami Ready Recognition Programme
- Sharing lessons learned from the UNESCAP Phase-2c Project on "Strengthening tsunami early warning in the North-West Indian Ocean through regional cooperation".


The approximate nightly for hotel accommodation is Rs.4000 (approximately USD 46) + taxes (12%) including buffet breakfast and dinner.

6. Local Transport


6.1 Airport to Hotel

INCOIS staff will meet participants at the airport to facilitate transport arrangements to the accommodation (INCOIS guesthouses and hotels).

In case of any difficulty in finding INCOIS staff on arrival, please use any authorized Taxi service such as MERU, SKYCABS, OLA, Uber, OHM for transportation from Airport to your place of stay. The approximate fare between the airport and hotel may vary from US\$10 to US\$20 depending on the time and type of vehicle chosen. The approximate fare to INCOIS is US\$20 to US\$30. INCOIS will reimburse this cost to the participant.

6.2 Hotel to Meeting Rooms

Participants staying in the INCOIS guest houses can walk down to the training facility. For participants staying in the recommended hotels to and from transport will be provided to the training venue on all the days. The commute time from the recommended hotels to the

training facility is expected to be about 45 minutes. Please board the INCOIS car / bus outside of the hotel lobby at 08:30 am each day.

7. Meals

Lunches and morning/afternoon snacks during the training workshop will be provided by INCOIS for all participants and facilitators at no cost.

For participants saying at the INCOIS guest house, daily buffet breakfasts and dinners will also be provided at no cost.

INCOIS will also host a dinner on one of the days to all participants.

8. Reduced Daily Subsistence Allowance (RDSA)

All participants eligible for funding support will receive a RDSA of US \$16 for incidentals each day they are in Hyderabad, which will depend on their flight schedule. Payment will be made into the nominated bank account/given to participants at the event.

9. Visa Requirements

All visitors to India must have a passport that is valid for 6 months and a visa. For the workshops and meetings, participants must apply for a Conference or Business visa for India. Please note that Tourist visas are not eligible to enter India for this purpose. Visas can be applied for in person or by post at the High Commission or embassy of India based in the country from where you intend to depart for India or at a nearby country. 10. Medical and Travel Insurance

Participants are responsible for monitoring the applicable health and travel requirements related to travel to Hyderabad, India. Participants are required to obtain their own travel insurance for the period of the training workshop. 12. Laptops and Local Datasets

Participants will be primarily using Microsoft Office, QGIS and an internet browser-based COMMIT software during the training. Participants are advised to bring their own laptops with a licensed Microsoft Windows Operating System, MS Office suite and anti-virus software. The trainers will support with installation of QGIS (version 3.40 Long Term Release) and any other specialised software required during the training. Participants are also advised to bring along high-resolution bathymetry and topography data as well as other geo-spatial datasets related to their coastal area for use during the training. These datasets will be extremely important to develop customized inundation and evacuation maps for the coastal area to implement the Tsunami Ready Recognition Programme.

13. Time

The time in Hyderabad, India is 5 hours 30 minutes ahead of UTC.

14. Weather

Hyderabad has a tropical climate with the monsoon season from June to October and the dry season from November to May. In April, the average daily temperature range is between 25°C (night) and 39°C (day). It is the dry season.

15. Money Matters

The currency used in India is the Indian Rupee (INR). One US dollar is approximately 87.47 Indian Rupee (UN exchange rate for 1 March 2025). You can find a money changer in the Airport as soon as you clear the immigration. There are also money changers in the city, in the hotels, malls, and Banks. Most shops accept credit card (Visa). Automatic Teller

Machines (ATMs) are also available in malls and banks; please note that the ATM only accepts cards with a Visa or Master Logo.

16. Places of Interest

Hyderabad is the third largest metropolitan city in India is the capital of Telangana state. Hyderabad was established by Mohammad Quli Qutub Shah, the fifth ruler of Qutub Shahi Dynasty in the year 1591. The city is famous for its riches, beautiful palaces, and of course its pearls and diamonds, during the reign of the 'Nizams' who ruled for over 200 years. Hyderabad has a wide collection of tourist attractions and activities; explore the historic monuments and museums, relax at the serene lakes and parks, relish the scrumptious cuisine, and enjoy the shopping experience. Hyderabad tenders a mesmerizing vista of the past, with a blend of rich, cultural, and historical custom traversing over 400 vibrant years. Charminar is the most important landmark in the city of Hyderabad. The monument was erected when Quli Qutb Shah shifted his capital from Golconda to Hyderabad. The monument got its name from its structure as it consists of four minarets. The other points of interest are Golconda Fort, Hussain Sagar Lake, Public Garden, Birla Mandir, Falaknuma Palace, Mecca Masjid, Chow-Mahalla Palace, Nehru Zoological Park, Sanghi Temple, Shilparamam, Osmania University, NTR Garden, Hyderabad Botanical Garden, Paigah Tombs, Ramoji Film City.
