Exercise Participants

On 15 Oct 2025, west coast of India participated in IOWave25 exercise up to SEOC/institute level. On 4 Nov, Andaman & Nicobar Islands conducted tsunami exercise up to community level. A total of 16 villages and 381 schools across three districts were involved and successfully evacuated. In all, 52,103 school students and teachers and 59,601 community members including disabilities, elderly, youth involved in evacuation, 111,704 participants in total.

Key agencies involved included NDMA, State/District DMOs, Indian Navy, Coast Guard, NDRF, Army, Port & Harbour, Power, Water, Fuel, Telecom, Shipping, Health, Fire & Rescue, Fisheries, and Petroleum sectors.

National Tsunami Warning & Mitigation System

The Indian Tsunami Early Warning Centre (ITEWC), established at Indian National Centre for Ocean Information Services (INCOIS) under the Ministry of Earth Sciences (MoES), Government of India, has been operational since 15 October 2007. It is equipped with comprehensive observational, computational, and communication systems that enable real-time data reception, analysis, and issuance of tsunami advisories as per a defined Standard Operating Procedure (SOP).

As a Tsunami Service Provider (TSP) alongside Australia and Indonesia, ITEWC provides tsunami advisories to Indian Ocean Rim countries under the IOC-UNESCO IOTWMS framework. Within India, ITEWC issues Warning/Alert/Watch advisories to national and state Disaster Management Organisations (DMOs), with NDMA, state/local DMOs, and media forming key components of the national warning chain. Public evacuation responsibilities rest with the respective state and local DMOs.

In support of tsunami preparedness, India has implemented UNESCO's Tsunami Ready programme. The Odisha State Disaster Management Authority (OSDMA), with support from INCOIS, achieved Tsunami Ready recognition for 26 villages in 2024, making India the country with the highest number of UNESCO-recognised Tsunami Ready communities to date.

National Organisation of Exercise IOWave25

India participated in IOWave25 tsunami exercise at national level on two dates, (i) Makran scenario on 15 October 2025, and (ii) Sumatra scenario on 5 November 2025. As a Tsunami Service Provider (TSP), ITEWC issued test bulletins to Indian Ocean countries for all four exercise scenarios.

In preparation for the exercise, India participated in IOTWMS pre-IOWave25 online workshop held on 4–6 August 2025, with over 120 participants from DMOs, Indian Coast Guard, Navy, NDRF, ports, shipping, oil & gas, and other sectors. INCOIS also conducted two conclaves for east and west coasts and discussed IOWave25 planning. A National Tsunami Exercise Manual was prepared and shared with all participating agencies. Coastal authorities conducted local training and coordination meetings.

West coast of India participated up to SEOC/institute level on 15 October. The east coast, except for A & N Islands, could not participate in exercise due to Cyclonic Storm Montha. A & N Islands participated up to community level on 4 November, with about 112,000 people from 16 coastal villages and 381 schools (tsunami walk) involved and evacuated to shelters. Overall public notification time was less than 10 minutes, used multiple communication channels. Tsunami Ready indicators were also tested for four Tsunami Ready implementing villages Aerial Bay, Karmatang (Mayabunder), Mus, and Campbell Bay.

Lessons Learnt

IOWave25 tsunami exercise was a major success, significantly strengthening awareness and preparedness among coastal communities, especially in A & N Islands. Continued efforts are essential, including regular volunteer training, drills, and coordination meetings. SOPs should be updated, with clear post-disaster reporting systems. Communication networks to be strengthened. Community outreach should be expanded, particularly in remote and island regions. Regular mock exercises, training, and awareness programmes at community level are vital. Tsunami Ready programme should be scaled up in vulnerable coastal villages.

Exercise aims to test Incident Response System of A&N Islands

The Andaman & Nicobar Administration and National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA), Government of India, New Delhi in collaboration with Indian National Centre for Ocean Information Services (INCOIS), MoES, GoI, Hyderabad will conduct the Inter State Mock Exercise (ISME) - 2025 on Earthquake and Tsunami

in the A&N Islands on 04th November, 2025.

This exercise aims to test the Incident Response System (IRS) of ANI, evaluate the readiness and coordination of emergency response mechanisms, and strengthen disaster preparedness across the A&N Islands by involving all Emergency Support Functionaries (ESFs), Incident Response Teams

(IRTs), and local communities. The exercise forms a vital component of the Administration's continuous efforts to enhance preparedness, coordination, and resilience of all response agencies.

The Director (Disaster Management), A&N Administration has requested the general public to extend their full cooperation during the

forthcoming mock exercise on earthquake and tsunami preparedness. He has advised all residents to remain calm and continue with their normal routine activities, as the exercise is a scheduled preparedness drill and poses no real threat to public safety.

Key Activities during the Exercise

- Increased Emergency Presence: Citizens may notice increased movement of emergency vehicles such as PCR vans, Fire Tenders, Ambulances, and other specialized units across the Islands.

The general public have been informed that the Sirens have been installed in the premises of Secretariat, DIBLATT, DSS Marine, Chatham Saw Mill (Forest Deptt), Police Station Aberdeen, Police Station Palasgaon, Police Station Chatham, JNRM, Fish Landing Centre, Junglighat, EOC, Forest Guest House Corbyn's Cove, Police Station Bambooflat, Police Station, Ognabraj, Police Station, Choudhatri, Police Station, Humfreygunj, O.P. Wimbertygunj, O.P. Borraganj, Police Booth, Hathitapu, OP Tirur, Tirur Jarawa Protection Post, OP Radhanagar, Rajiv Gandhi Aquaculture, Kodiyghat, Police Station, Shaheed Dweep, Police Station, Svaraj Dweep, Nimbatala, Bangat, OP 19 Km, R.E. Pur, L/Andaman, Fire Station, Hut Bay (L/Andaman), EOC, Car Nicobar, A.E. Office, APWD, Tenessa, JE Office, APWD, Chowra, A.E. Office, APWD, Katchal, EOC, Kamorta and EOC, Campbell Bay for use of issuance of alerts & warnings to the general public during any disaster/emergency through blowing of sirens at high pitch/volume.

Sirens of Electronic Display Board installed at Police Control Room, State Control Room, Junglighat (Fisheries Deptt), Met Office, MRCC, JOC, INS Jarawa, Fisheries Deptt at Rangat, EOC at Mayabunder, MRCC at Diglipur, Fisheries Deptt. at Hut Bay, EOC at Kamorta, EOC at Car Nicobar, and MRCC & EOC at Campbell Bay will also be blown in a similar manner.

The general public have been requested to not to panic during blowing of sirens for Inter State Mock Exercise 2025 Nov. 4 from 08.15 am to 10.30 am. Inter-State Mock Disaster Management Exercise on Earthquake & Tsunami conducted in A&N Islands

An Inter-State Mock Disaster Management Exercise (ISME-2025) Earthquake & Tsunami was conducted today by the Directorate of Disaster Management, A&N Administration, in coordination with the National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA), New Delhi, Indian National Centre for Ocean Information Services (INCOIS), Hyderabad, Andaman & Nicobar Command (ANC), National Disaster Response Force (NDRF), District Administrations and other Emergency Support Functionaries (ESFs) of the A&N Islands. The exercise simulated an earthquake followed by a tsunami scenario.

The objective of the exercise was to test the Incident Response System (IRS) and assess the level of preparedness of all



stakeholders in the A&N Islands. ISME-2025 commenced with the detection of an earthquake by INCOIS at 8:45 AM, followed by the issuance of a tsunami alert to local authorities at 8:46 AM.

During the exercise, sirens were activated across the entire UT of A&N Islands. Alerts and warnings were issued, and Incident Response Teams (IRTs) carried out operations at identified incident sites. Search and Rescue (SAR) teams were deployed by the District Administrations, with assistance from the A&N Command and NDRF for rescue and evacuation operations. Various Departments, including Police, APWD, Shipping, Controller of Ports, SVP&C, Education, and

from INCOIS, Hyderabad, to the State Emergency Operation Centre (SEOC) at Aspada Prashasan Bhawan, Sri Vijaya Puram.

This initiative has been designed to bring the Administration to the doorstep of people and

reinforce the commitment towards responsive, transparent and citizen-centric governance. Under this programme, the Deputy Commissioner, North & Middle Andaman, along with the concerned Assistant
